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Course Content

Biology, which is the study of life and living things, will focus on making students understand the relationship and nature between form and function in different organisms (from a bacteria, to a maple tree to an orangutan to YOU, a human). The principal aim of the course is to instill a sense of curiosity and discovery in looking at the living world. This course is aimed for students who love the natural world but are not necessarily pursuing science as a study or career path.

This course will be presented using lectures, hands-on activities, discovery TV clips, individual research work done by students, and through classroom demonstrations. Hands-on laboratory and fieldwork will be used as much as possible to reinforce the theoretical material covered in the course.
